<b>Afternoons</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Be active</li><li>• Have fun</li><li>• Make a meal together</li></ul>

At High Lane, we recognise that each family’s situation is different, which is why we have not allocated days or times to the work provided. If school is closed or you are self-isolating, it is important for children to be accessing English, Maths and Reading daily, in equal measure with breaks, opportunities for other areas of their learning to be reviewed and quality family time.

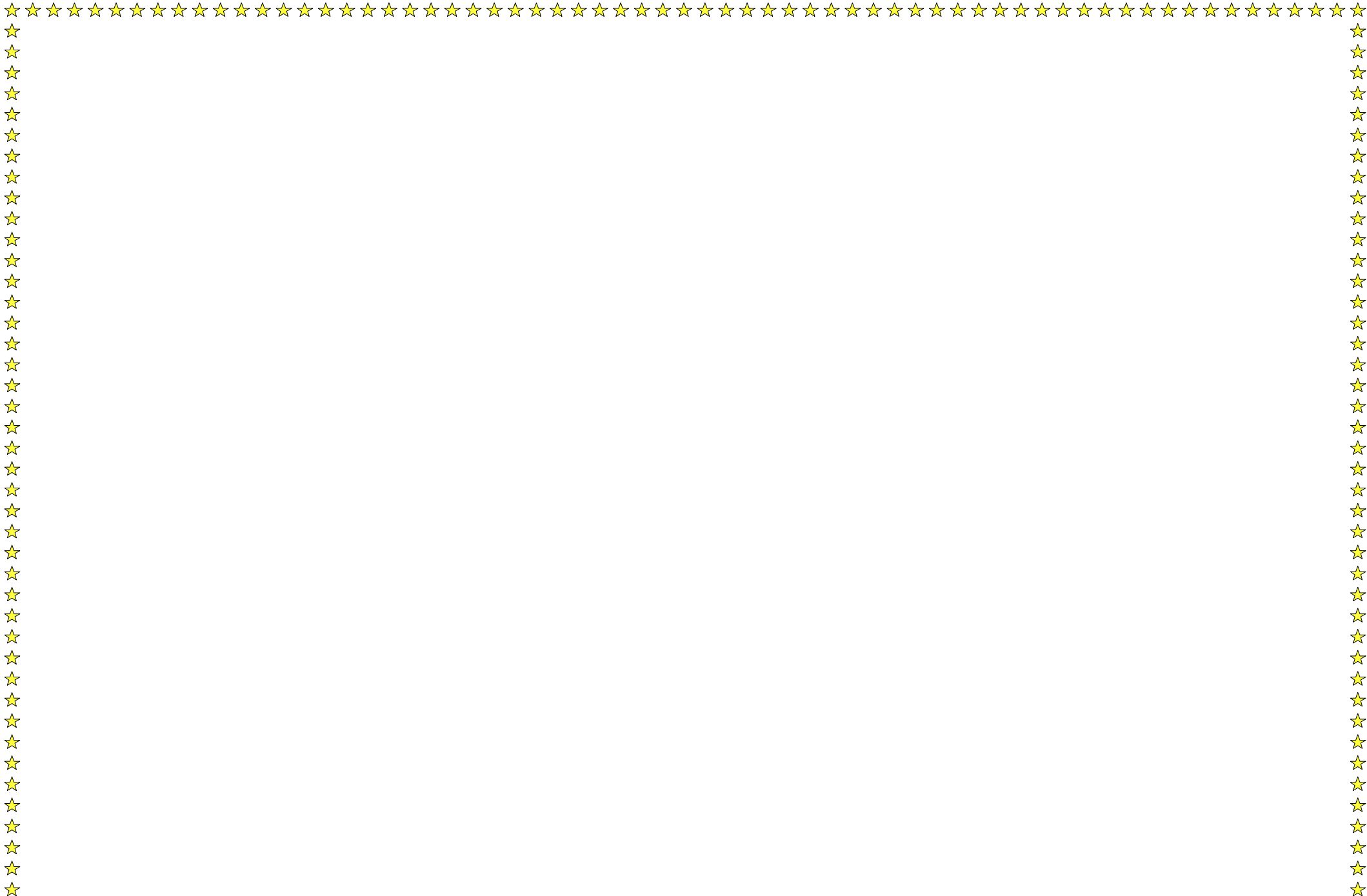

<b>Literacy</b>	<p>Share a story each day. Here are some activities of various levels:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>*Name writing</li> <li>*Letter writing</li> <li>*Writing simple words</li> <li>*Writing simple sentences</li> <li>*Writing extended pieces such as diary entries, short stories and instructions.</li> </ul>	<p>Practise forming letters. Have a go at cursive writing formation. (Cursive writing alphabet will be added soon).</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>*Play family board games together.</li> <li>*Play memory games such as Kim's Game.</li> <li>*Use your imagination and try some role-play (for example shops or doctors).</li> </ul>	
<b>Numeracy</b>	<p><b>Numbers</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>*Work on recognising and forming the numerals up to 5, then 10, then 20.</li> <li>*Look for numbers around your house (on packages etc).</li> </ul>	<p><b>Shape, space and measure.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>*Identify shapes around the home.</li> <li>*Have a go at measuring. Use kitchen scales. Use spoons or lollipop sticks to measure the length of household objects.</li> </ul>
