

This grid is a selection of activities for you to try. You do not need to do them all and if you need more, just contact me via ClassDojo.

Make a rainbow picture. You could stick this in your window. Look for other rainbow pictures if you go for a walk.	Make a rainbow using objects from around your house.	Make a list (with your grown-ups) of 7 objects; one for each colour of the rainbow.
What is favourite colour? Draw a picture using your favourite colour. How many things can you think of that are the same colour?	Look through your stories at home. Can you find any stories about colour?	Learn the rainbow song in sign language. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=yLpEGM34Fic
Rainbow experiment. Make your own rainbow. (See separate sheet)	How many numbers in a rainbow? 7 Use 7 objects to make different number sentences. How many ways can you make 7? For example: 1+6 = 7 etc. Can you write your number sentences down?	Make a number bond rainbow. (See separate sheet. You don't need to print this out. You can create your own on blank paper).
There are some rainbow 2Dos on Purple Mash.	Keep practising your Phonics. You could use Phonics Play.	Keep an eye on ClassDojo. I'll be posting some sentence reading and writing activities each day.
Try using numbots with your new log in: https://play.numbots.com/	Tune into ClassDojo each night for a bedtime story.	Try to eat a rainbow. (This may be hard if shopping has been tricky so don't worry if you can't). How many different colour foods can you eat this week? Tick off each colour as you do it.
