#### **Rules and Routines**

Our rules and routines ensure that our school can run safely and efficiently and we appreciate your support in adhering to them. Please ensure you read the most recent Notes and Reminders document for parents which sets out many of the day-to-day procedures in school (see this week's ClassDojo).

We would kindly request that parents and carers pay particular attention to the following:

- Please avoid booking holidays in term time if at all possible as holidays will not be authorised and unauthorised absence may result in a significant Local Authority fine.
- Please ensure you order all school lunches in advance. This applies to all meals, including universal infant and free school meals as well as paid meals.
- For parents who pay for school lunches, please ensure and there are sufficient funds in your Parentpay account to cover the cost of the meal at the time of ordering. The order will not register if there are not sufficient funds to cover it.
- Please ensure correct PE kit is worn on PE days (see Notes and Reminders for uniform list)
- If children have recently pierced ears, these MUST be removed for swimming lessons in line with school swimming regulations. For other PE activities, please ensure they bring tape or plasters from home to cover them for the first six weeks, then learn to take them out for PE.
- Long hair must be tied back in school and novelty headbands should not be worn. This is for health and safety reasons and to avoid the spread of headlice.
- As we move into the Winter Season, it's essential that we try to keep the school community as healthy as possible. Please support us in this by encouraging good hygiene habits (blowing nose, flushing toilet, washing hands).
- If your child is sick or has a tummy upset, please keep them at home for 48 hours after the sickness or diarrhoea has stopped, in line with NHS advice.
