

MAKE A RECYCLED JELLYFISH

Although they make up only 10 per cent of the ocean, the shallow waters of the coastal seas are home to 90 per cent of all marine species. Sadly, plastic pollution can now be found on every beach in the world, from busy tourist beaches to uninhabited, tropical islands. We must make sure we reduce, reuse and recycle single use plastic to protect coastal seas and marine life.

What you'll need:

- A recycled yoghurt pot
- Colourful tissue paper
- Recycled wrapping paper and gift ribbon
- · Eco-friendly glue
- Scissors





How to make a recycled jellyfish:

- 1. Decorate your recycled yoghurt pot with felt tip pens, recycled wrapping paper and colourful tissue.
- 2. Cut some long strips of tissue paper and reycyled gift ribbon and stick them to the inside of the rim of the yoghurt

ne inside of the rim of the yoghur pot.

- 3. Ask an adult to help you make a hole in the base of the yoghurt pot.
 - 4. Thread a string or ribbon through the hole and hang your recycled jellyfish in a window or doorway.

Get creative: have a look in your recycling bin and see if you can turn any other plastic items into different coastal sea creatures and make an ocean display!
